

**Dear Oxyganic,**

**I have been using Oxyganic Bird formula for over two years now and just had to share my experiences with you. I started out with 2 Amazon parrots and 3 smaller birds and the product had been great for them, I noticed beautiful feathers, less bird dust and easier to clean cages, Spraying the birds with the diluted product has been wonderful for bird odors as my larger parrots get fresh fruits, vegetables and pasta-rice and therefore can get odors from this food being on them after eating it, the Oxyganic spray bath really gets rid of the bird odors and cleans them beautifully. I love the fact I can spray the cages with the birds still inside with no harm done to the birds, and they love it!**

**Just recently I adopted a Moluccan Cockatoo from rescue and when I got him he was lacking any color other than his orange crest, well in the 6 months I have had him he has been on the Oxyganic in his water daily and daily spray baths and now he is a beautiful peach color and yellow under is wings each time he molts an new beautiful color feather replaces the old dull white ones! One other thing I noticed is he was wheezy also when he first came home with me and never having a Cockatoo before I did not know if this was normal or not. Cockatoo's are powder birds but this too has resolved itself and I no longer hear him wheeze. He is absolutely beautiful, not to mention he is much happier and playful and full of life and I can only attribute that to Oxyganic!**

**I am now part of the rescue group and have foster birds in my care, I am using Oxyganic on them also daily and have seen great improvements in them. One Sulfur Crested Cockatoo is a plucker with dry skin, she gets sprayed daily and it is in her drinking water and so far she is letting her feathers grow back! Hopefully this will last as Cockatoo's do have plucking issues. Another Indian Ringneck is a frightened bird and she was banging herself in her cage and broke some wing blood feathers, I sprayed the area with full strength Oxyganic just 3 sprays and set her on a playstand to watch her, after awhile the bleeding ceased and I sprayed her with 3 more sprays and put her back in her cage. The next morning the area was all dried up and she had taken off the damaged feathers and all is fine. I was told by other bird people that I should have held her and took pliers to pluck those feathers out, but carefully so as not to break the wing doing so. I am so happy I did not have to resort to doing this..**
